## **ELECTRICAL LICENSING AND INSPECTION**

The City of Minnetrista Building Department requires inspections of electrical work within the city. All work must be done by and permits are only issued to licensed electrical contractors. Except, that an owner of a single family residence, may do electrical work and may obtain permits for work conducted by the owner provided they occupy that dwelling.
